First Training Since COVID-19

God In Our Image

Inspired by my interaction with my clients during counseling sessions, I decided to write this article. In this short piece, I will point out the importance of knowing, believing and building our Christian faith on the God of the Bible. Nothing more, nothing less. Any deviation from the biblical description of God, we are not talking about the same God.

In the few years that I have been counseling, I have noticed that a good number of Christians have a distorted view of God or their understanding is based on what my pastor calls "patches and pieces" of information that they have gathered from sermons, various books, society, religious background mixed with their own idea what God should look or be like. Undoubtedly, the only possible outcome of this mixed character attribution to the Christian God is that one ends up standing before an idol, hence, the confusion and discontentment.

"What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us. ... The most portentous fact about any man [or woman] is not what he at a given time may say or do, but what he in his deep heart conceives God to be like." A.W. Tozer The Knowledge of the Holy."

Living out the mandates of scripture at best is hard; at worst it is impossible without the help of the Holy Spirit. But if we do not understand who the Holy Spirit is and what His role is in our lives, we will be stuck between emotionalism and legalism. That is why Christians cannot

afford to get this wrong. Our sanctification hinges on our understanding of who God is. So, what do we do? Based on my past personal experience with confusion and discontentment, the remedy, I think, for every follower of Jesus who wants an authentic relationship with him is to take an honest look into our hearts and see what we actually believe about who God is. Then compare our findings with scripture and be willing to wrestle and bring every thought that is in contradiction to the Bible to submission. "We tear down arguments and every proud obstacle that is raised against the knowledge of God, taking every thought captive in order to obey the Messiah." (2 Cor. 10:4-5).

However, it won't be easy because we might not want to give up the image of God that we have learned to be comfortable with. We might not want to know the God who might chose not to heal us, answer our questions, relieve our pain or rescue us. We might not want to hear that His grace is sufficient and His strength is revealed in our weakness. We might not want to bear our cross, love Him more than money, family or self. We might not want to be still and know that He is God. We might not want to hear that He allows painful things to come our way. But it behooves us to know and live the whole truth not patches and pieces of the truth. So, take heart, got to the mat and see the victory God will grant you.
